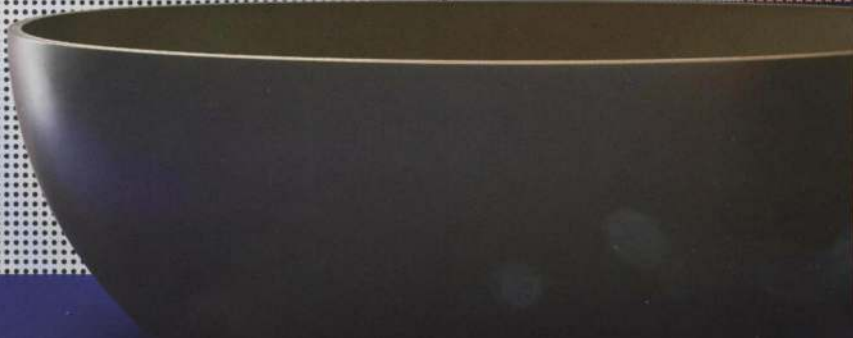

STRIPES
